Just as blue, which is the only colour which maintains its own character in all its tones, our students have made their presence felt in the crowd and have also complimented others from time to time.

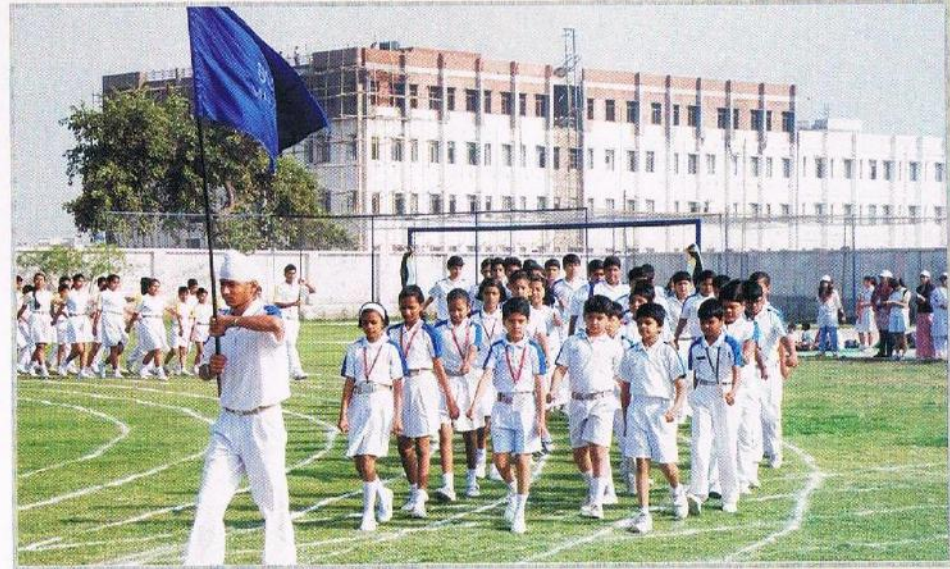

The Stockholm conference in 1972 was the 1st event of its kind which touched the problem of environmental degradation through sustainable development .It was the first major global event based on addressing environment arrangement by the U.N. The result of the Stockholm conference was the creation of United Nation Environment Programme. Our then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi was one of the few leaders of the developing world who attended this conference.

20 years after the Stockholm conference the U.N conference on environment and development was held in Rio De Janeiro in 1992.

In 2002 world summit on sustainable development Johannesburg was held. The United Nations conference on sustainable development also known as Earth Summit 2012 was the third international conference on sustainable development.

For developing countries, rapid industrialization is a need but industrialization should be done through clean development mechanism. Under the Kyoto Protocol Industrialized world has adopted second commitment period till 2020 for carbon emission reduction. The world is also recognizing biodiversity as a driver of sustainable development and environment protection.

Humanity has traditionally put its faith in advances of technology to ensure development sustainably.
