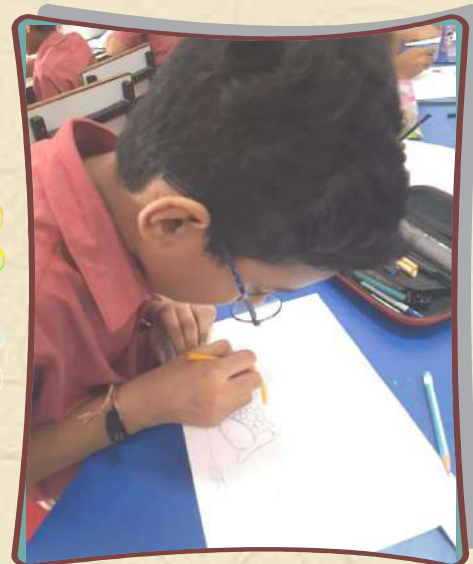

### Rope Hopping (Grades 9A, 9B & 11 - Boys and Girls):

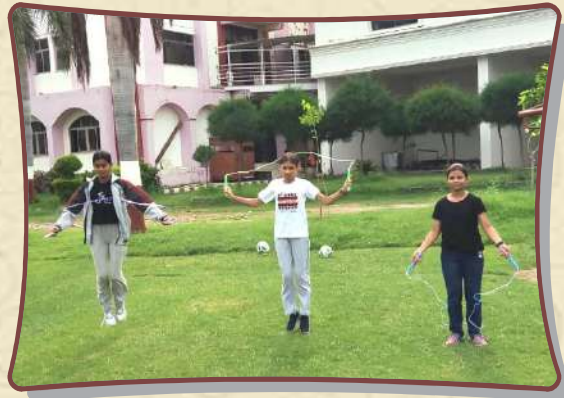
